Year 3 and 4

The topic that year three and four pupils have studied this term was Moon Zoom. The pupils have been exploring planets and brave pioneers who have gone where no one has gone before! Pupils even spent time watching an astronaut take them on a visit through the International Space Station. It was exciting to see how gravity, and the lack thereof, affects the way things we take for granted, are affected. Pupils attended Gymnastics twice, an adventure indeed!!! Trampolines, forward rolls, games, balance bar and so many ways to use improve our flexibility! So much confidence gained, so much bravery developed.

Pupil Corner

This festive period, year 5/6 welcomed the Crossteach staff into school and learned all about the origins of Christianity and why Christmas is so special to people of the Christian faith. The boys engaged enthusiastically and staff were very proud of them.

Year 10

One of our year 10 pupils has begun volunteering with the Nottingham City Gymnastics Club, helping younger pupils improve their physical literacy. Looking forward to the Spring term, the academy will continue to explore links with other providers, one of which is Stone Bridge City Farm who have agreed to facilitate work experience for a number of our year 10 pupils within their café and animal barn.

Year 11 work experience

Eight year 11 pupils have successfully completed work experience placements and achieved a range of City and Guilds qualifications in construction,

painting and decorating and joinery. In partnership with the Volunteer It Yourself Programme, feedback has been extremely positive from pupils. Post sixteen programmes have already been offered to two pupils.



Year 7 and 8

Year 7 and Year 8 have made wooden puzzles based on the brightly coloured Memphis style products of the 1980s.

Year 7 have also started work in the food room learning about nutrition and understanding the Eatwell Plate. They made a tasty tomato soup, an apple crumble and a homity pie. These are all recipes they can practice again at home.

Year 8 have also started their textiles rotation and will be learning how to hand sew and how to use a sewing machine.

Year 9, 10 and 11

Year 9 have completed their Food rotation based upon dishes from around the world. They have also practiced a full range of skills that will support them in Year 10. They have made some flavoursome dishes including spaghetti Bolognese, sausage bake, paella, and burgers and curry.

Year 10 are embarking upon the D&T mock coursework and Year 11 have started their final examination coursework for their GCSE studying Climate Change as the basis for their research.

In Food the Year 10 and Year 11 pupils are practising toward their Level 1 Food Skills BTEC award. They have used a range of skills to cook sweet and savoury dishes and will be doing a final dish later in the year for their exam. In addition, they have also cooked soup, Christmas cakes, Christmas puddings and mince pies for the Academy Christmas Fayre.
